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




Our Story So Far




PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOPS

MENTORING

The Gii team has mentored over 350 young adults in the course of the year. The programs included:

High School Partnership Program

In Feb 2021, the Global Impact Initiative launched its High School Partnership Program. In this program, we partner with high schools across the United States and provide bimonthly structured professional development workshops to the students. In addition, we connect high school seniors to pre-selected undergraduate and graduate students who mentor the high schoolers virtually for 8/10/12 weeks.

Alleghany High School in Virginia, USA, was the first school to participate in this program, and Gii had the opportunity to provide workshops to seniors and juniors on various topics, including professional development, effective communication and resume building. Gii was then able to provide one-on-one mentoring to interested seniors. Approximately 73 students were provided with professional development workshops directly in the classroom during school hours.









Virtual Mentorship Program

The Global Impact Initiative's Mentorship Program is focused on providing underserved students and young adults with mentors who can help them develop and clarify their academic and career goals. The duration of the program is 3 months, with bi-monthly 30-minute sessions in either a group or one-on-one format. Gii develops a custom experience crafted to each mentee's unique aspirations and needs and connects each mentee with a knowledgeable and experienced mentor. In this way, Gii provides support to areas throughout the world, serving, empowering and uplifting under-resourced communities that would otherwise not have access to such programs.

Our 2021 cohort had 16 participants (8 Pairs). In addition to mentoring, there were regular check-in's with mentors and mentees and optional workshops.

MENTORING

Peer-to-Peer Mentorship Program

Partnering with a US Mission project in Turkey called Be the Voice of Girls, Gii has developed a peer-to-peer mentoring program focused on providing a space to build mutually supportive and beneficial relationships between 2 people or groups of people who are at the same career stage/age. This is being done in collaboration with the Indian Academy in Lucknow, India.





Virtual Mentoring for Afghan Refugees

The Gii leadership and some of its Global Ambassadors are currently conducting an online support program for Afghan women. 60 families are participating in this program, and we currently have a waiting list of an additional hundred families.

WORKPLACE READINESS PROGRAM

In October of 2021, Gii was awarded the **US State Department Grant** for workforce preparation. Through this grant, we are developing and launching a Workplace Readiness Program, which will impact young adults throughout the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. This program helps address deficits in job skills, enabling young adults to enter the workforce better prepared for the tasks that they will face. Gii has partnered with KEYSS, a Saudi Arabian organization which is also dedicated to preparing young adults for the workforce. This program has two tier options - one for high school students and the other for college students.



In addition to the above grant, Gii has developed a Virtual Workplace Readiness Program which can be offered to our target populations in countries outside Saudi Arabia.



TIER 1

- High School students or graduates
- 10 weeks in length
- · Internship component with Gii's industry partners
- Weekly virtual seminars to cover program material



TIER 2

- College students or graduates
- 8 weeks in length
- 3 days of seminars per week
- Capstone Project, which will require research, problem analysis, collaboration, and marketing

TEACHER TRAINING

The Organization for the Rescue of Vulnerable Children (OSEM)

OSEM is a charity located in the Republic of Guinea, which assists vulnerable and marginalized children. Many of these individuals are permanently displaced refugees, born during the atrocities of the Liberian Civil War. Gii has provided teacher training opportunities for our OSEM partners stationed in Nzérékoré, Guinea. We covered topics related to Classroom Management and Lesson Planning. This training is part of Gii's International Teacher Training Program, where we provide structured learning opportunities to educators around the world who reside or teach within impoverished communities or nations. OSEM currently reaches 116 children, providing primary and secondary education in Nzérékoré from nursery level through grade 9.



TEACHER TRAINING

International Teacher Training Programs

Gii has finalized its partnerships with other organizations in various countries in an effort to expand our International Teacher Training Program. We have been delighted to begin working with our partners in Uganda and Haiti and are looking forward to developing our relationships in the Philippines in 2022. We anticipate working with 100-150 schools as the program grows.

Gii is assisting by providing:

- · Leadership training for the organization's leadership
- Teacher training for the organization's volunteer and paid teaching staff. This is being done through coordination with multiple volunteer K-12 teachers across the United States.



UGANDA

We have partnered with the Union of Community Development Volunteers to examine funding opportunities to provide them with Teacher Training Programs.



We have partnered with Spare-a-coin 2savechildren to identify educational needs in Haiti schools. At this time, upwards of 34 schools are interested in our Teacher Training Program. We are currently examining funding opportunities, which will assist in the roll out of this program.





THE PHILIPPINES

Gii is in the process of finalizing a partnership for teacher training in the Philippines which will be conducted online by US Master teacher Trainers.

Partnerships/MOUs

In 2021 Gii signed Partnership Agreements/MOUs with the following global entities:



BE THE VOICE OF GIRLS

Be the Voice of Girls is based in Turkey. Gii will be conducting peer-to-peer mentoring sessions, pairing 21 eighth grade students from Turkey with students from India. This is part of a US Mission project.

LEO EDUCATION

In June, Gii announced a partnership with Leonard Education, a nonprofit that works with students from Palestine and the West Bank to enhance their personal development through guidance and mentoring. Gii and LEO are working on empowering young men and women, helping with ESL and assisting with university placement.





CROWN PRINCE FOUNDATION

Gii is working with the Crown Prince Foundation in Jordan to develop programs for access to virtual internships, workforce readiness and study abroad preparation.

EDUCAIT

Educait is a fund created to help high-achieving students in under-resourced communities. Gii is providing mentors, and Educait is selecting the students as mentees for the mentor program. The program is targeted to have 10-12 sets of mentors and mentees.



Partnerships/MOUs

BRIDGING TECH

Bridging Tech is a 501c3 non-profit with a mission to bridge the digital divide for K-12 affected by students homelessness providing educational opportunities technology. Together, Gii and Bridging Tech provide mentorship to under-resourced students in an effort to support and empower them. Bridging Tech will also be supplying computers and iPads to students served by Gii.






LEBANESE DEVELOPMENT NETWORK (LDN)

LDN is a national non-profit organization dedicated to assisting individuals develop their capacities by raising awareness and enhancing technical skills. Together with LDN, Gii is promoting global, academic and commercial partnerships.

THE THINKUBATOR

The Global Impact Initiative and The Thinkubator partnering to address youth workforce development. Both organizations have successfully launched several programs focused on training and supporting youth, with The Thinkubator's focus being on youth from the New York City area, specifically from the Bronx, and Gii's focus being global. The recent Robinhood grant to The Thinkubator supports a year-long initiative focusing on the organization's ability to deliver a program that is inclusive. The Thinkubator plans to support BIPOC youth and work to provide a systemic approach to workforce, employment and economic development, educational attainment and combating poverty. Gii will assist The Thinkubator in finding internships for approximately 250 students and getting them ready for that internship experience.





Global Higher Education Conference

Gii was a strategic partner for the first major conference on international higher education in the Gulf Region since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic. With over 1100 registrants from 69 countries and 38 global academic leaders presenting, the summit was a huge success.



Higher education globally is going through challenging times. However, it is also a golden opportunity to reimagine the sector through embracing new modalities, adapting business models, widening access, developing new partnerships and putting high quality innovative teaching and learning at the heart of its transformation. Critical to this has to be bold, forward-thinking and possibly nontraditional leadership.



Global Ambassador Program

Gii launched its Global Ambassador Program (GAP) in July of 2021 in an effort to connect with thought-leaders in diverse fields around the globe. GAP members act as a bridge and catalyst between their communities and Gii to expand Gii's reach and global network. GAP members work with Gii's Leadership Team to promote Gii's programs within their respective communities and fields, as well as identify needs for programs and opportunities for funding. We continue to seek global thought-leaders who have been engaged in their community in a leadership role and are passionate about building bridges internationally to support underserved communities. Currently, we have six Global Ambassadors from India, UAE, Saudi Arabia, Poland, Iceland and the United States.



Charity Drive for Afghan Refugees

Gii is currently helping 60 Afghan families resettle in Austin, Texas, after leaving their homes in the past year. The Global Impact Initiative raised funds to support language-learning, mentoring, workforce readiness opportunities and general resettlement support for Afghan refugees in the United States. We are incredibly touched and inspired by the generosity of so many from across the world for our timesensitive fundraiser.
